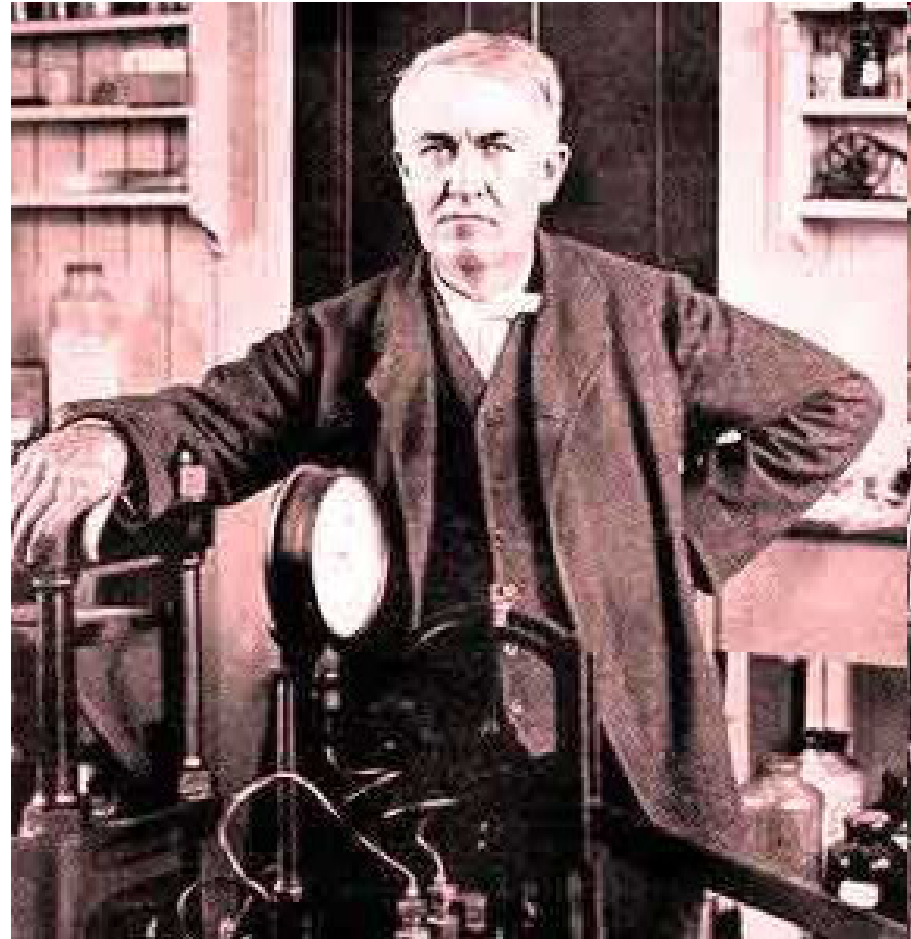
Europe 2020 targets

- 75 % of the population (20-64) employed,
- 20/20/20 Climate energy targets,
- Early school leavers under 10 % and 40 % of younger generation tertiary degree
- 20 million less people should be in poverty
- 3 % GDP – invested in R & D

work in agriculture, industry, services and administration that contributes to preserving or restoring the quality of the environment while also meeting requirements of decent work (UNEP,ILO,IOE,ITUC 2008)
