Replay-VET is a new tool designed to highlight the potential that exists within an aging labour market for generating new jobs and new careers for excluded and disadvantaged young people

Eurostat news release on Internet use in the EU, 2018 – digitalisation at work



16% of employed internet users reported changes in their job tasks due to new software or computerised equipment.

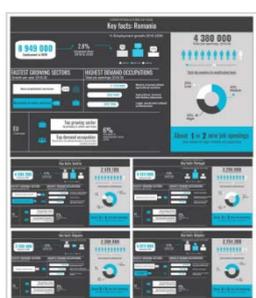
At the beginning of 2018, 87% of people in the European Union (EU), aged between 16 and 74 years, had used internet at least once in the last twelve months. Of those internet users that were employed, 71% reported using computers, laptops, smartphones, tablets or other portable devices at work and 19% used computerised equipment or machinery. Cedefop launches online surveys on skills anticipation and matching systems



Since 2017, and on their request, Cedefop has been working intensively with national authorities and stakeholders in Greece, Estonia, Bulgaria and Slovakia, to support them in strengthening their skills anticipation and matching capacities. Effective ‘skills governance’ means developing relevant, reliable and regularly updated skills and labour market intelligence and ensuring that policy-makers use it to strengthen links between education and training systems and labour market needs. Cedefop publication: Skills forecast: trends and challenges to 2030



In this publication, Cedefop presents the latest results of skill supply and demand forecasts. Alongside the updated projections, collaboration between Cedefop and Eurofound has allowed examination of the tasks and skills content of the current and projected employment structure of Europe. This analysis confirms an increasingly more polarised occupational structure, a trend also highlighted by the main projections. Find the publication [here](#).

Digital skills and VET in Romanian EU Presidency's programme



The EU new Presidency's programme, published on 15 January, focuses on ‘cohesion, a common European value’ and includes provisions for vocational education and training (VET), digital skills and mobility. The programme is mainly future-oriented stating that ‘innovation and research contribute to job creation, and help increase companies’ competitiveness on global markets, improve people’s quality of life and generate sustainable economic growth.’ It makes the case for ‘a significant decrease of the digital gap between Member States, regions, categories of European citizens, and industrial sectors.’ It calls for special attention ‘to developing and implementing measures to improve digital skills and digital literacy, including by making this a long-term priority for the EU.’ Read more [here](#).

A debate jointly organised by Cedefop and Ms Anne Sander (MEP) will focus on the issue of the future of vocational education and training (VET) in Europe. The event will provide an opportunity for Cedefop to inform the Members on the latest work of Cedefop on the rapidly changing nature and role of VET in Europe. Building on research covering a total of 30 countries, a set of 'Scenarios 2035' will be presented, illustrating the choices faced by policy makers and stakeholders in the years ahead. The seminar provides an opportunity to reflect on the role played by VET in the overall education and training system as well as in relation to the labour market and society at large.
