Short description	Beneficiaries of this scheme include all types of learners (employees, persons with parental leave benefit, persons on parental leave, marginally employed, unemployed, self-employed, freelancer, academics with a max gross income of EUR 2 700, entrepreneurs with a maximum of 5 employees) as long as they are residents of Upper Austria. The co-funding share is 30% of the costs for training and education, up to EUR 2 000. Professionally oriented further training and re-training are the eligible types of training to be funded. Office of the Upper Austrian government, Department Education and Society, governs, administers, and takes responsibility for the whole scheme.

Financing formula and allocation mechanisms	Co-funding: 30 % of the costs for education and training up to a maximum amount of 2 000 (preferential treatment: 60% up to 2 400) in period 1 January 2019 - 31 December 2022. If limit of reimbursement is reached, the next account can be claimed in 2023. Individuals may be granted more than 1 ILA per year, as long as the limit of reimbursement is not reached. Allocation: money is transferred to a learner's individual bank account.
