Description

The Law of 22 November 2018 supports the setting up of the so-called 'ancillary occupations'. Ancillary occupations are targeted at people with minor intellectual disabilities. As a consequence of the change, when introducing a new occupation or changing an existing one, the relevant minister is required to either propose the possibility of establishing an ancillary occupation or to provide justification for why this is not possible. Learners may take the exam in their occupation or in an ancillary occupation if such an ancillary occupation was created.

2018 Approved/Agreed

The regulation was approved and put in effect.
