## Background

The National strategy for responsible development is an update of the key document: National development strategy 2020.

The strategy was developed in response to the following barriers to socioeconomic development: middle income trap, economic imbalance trap, average product trap, demographic and institutional weakness (low efficiency of State institutions). Social disparities and persisting geographic diversity in social and economic development were also recognised.

## Objectives

The main objective of the strategy is to increase income and social, economic, environmental and territorial cohesion.

This would be achieved through:

- (a) sustainable economic growth increasingly driven by knowledge data and organisational excellence;
- (b) socially sensitive and territorially sustainable development;
- (c) effective State and economic institutions contributing to growth as well as social and economic inclusion.

## Description

The National strategy for responsible development (*Strategia na Rzecz Odpowiedzialnego Rozwoju - 'Morawiecki Plan' - SRD*) was adopted by the Council of Ministers in February 2017. It addresses the challenges, which the country will be facing until 2030, in particular in the areas of social and regional development, reduction of poverty and social exclusion, as well as demographic challenges. In education, the following actions were prioritised:

- (a) promoting dual VET, further linking school learning with practical training;
- (b) increasing the engagement of employers and employer associations in the development of vocational education, in particular through the co-development of core curricula;

- (c) monitoring the labour market and changes in professions to readjust education policies as needed;
- (d) developing teacher training by responding to the changing needs of industry (Industry 4.0).

The strategy is being implemented through public projects/initiatives. It also lists exemplary flagship projects particularly important for economic development. Every strategic area has a dedicated project or set of projects to help reach the strategy's goals. In education, strategic projects include initiatives such as the Integrated qualifications system, innovative competence teaching and IT infrastructure for schools. In addition, the Strategy for persons with disabilities 2021-30 and the Accessibility Plus programme 2018-25 are being implemented based on the National strategy for responsible development.
