Description

19 vocational and higher education institutions have developed e-career platforms where employers can advertise practice placements and job offers for students. Career e-platforms are websites where the employer can easily register and post practice placements or jobs to students. Students can view, save and apply for these ads. It is no longer necessary for the employer to send word or pdf advertisements to the school, and contact the school administration if any corrections or changes are required; it is now possible to do so electronically. It is also easy for education institutions to attract and work with many more employers. Such institutions can look at job vacancy statistics, employer and student activity, allowing conclusions to be drawn about labour market demand.
