Apart from contributing to the ILO's Green Jobs portfolio, Christine has developed a resource guide on upgrading informal apprenticeship in Africa, delivers trainings and advises technical cooperation projects in countries in Asia and Africa. Before joining the ILO, she worked in political consulting and coordinated development projects for trade unions in Africa and Asia for a German labour foundation promoting social sustainability in national and international fora such as the UN CSD.
