#### **Rationale**

Over the last several years and especially during the Swedish presidency of the EU many important aspects of teachers' and trainers' professional development have been highlighted and studied in a more detailed way. Member states have been asked by the Council of the European Union to put more efforts in supporting human capital in education and training, and the European Commission to address challenges and support co-operation in order to improve education and training systems.

The informal meeting of the Ministers for Education on 24/09/2009 in Göteborg stated that the motivation, skills and competences of teachers as well as the quality of school leadership are key factors in achieving high quality learning outcomes.

This, as well as the statement of the Swedish Education Minister, Jan Björklund, '*The quality of school could never exceed the quality of its teaching staff*', applies also to Vocational Education and Training and Adult Learning.

How to provide teachers, trainers and leaders in education and training with the competences they need to better support learning for better jobs and successful social inclusion? How to support them to better meet these and further challenges of today and tomorrow?

#### **Objectives**

Based on latest research, collection of good practice examples, EU policy documents and peer learning activities as well as contributions from the TTnet network, the TTnet Annual Conference has the objective to discuss and contribute to the following issues:

- the role and impact of mentoring in enhancing quality in the teaching/training profession;
- making further steps in the professional development of in-company trainers;

- policies and practices to equip leaders for their role to create a stimulating teaching and learning environment.

Future activity lines for TTnet in 2011-2012 in the field of ‘inclusive teaching’, ‘teaching and learning outcomes’ and ‘mobility and internationalisation’ will also be discussed.

Participants will consider both political and practical trends and issues, will examine case studies and good examples, will discuss on potential actions and will formulate key messages on the topics of the conference to be considered both from the side of the policy makers and the practitioners and both on national and European level.

The conference will bring together policy makers, representatives of European and international institutions, training practitioners, representatives of training institutes and researchers.
