Cedefop will pay the medical officer on the basis of an hourly rate and the number of hours worked.

The medical officer shall sign monthly time sheets for the hours worked. On a bimonthly basis, the medical officer shall provide Cedefop with an invoice. He/she shall annex to that invoice the detailed time sheets and a short summary of services rendered during the 2 previous months. Incomplete residual hours will be taken into account for the calculation of the invoice amount in accordance with the formula: (hourly rate/60) * minutes worked.

If the medical officer is invited by Cedefop to travel outside the Thessaloniki region for the purpose of this contract, travel and subsistence costs will be paid/reimbursed in accordance with the applicable rules (see Annex IV to the framework contract) and the hourly fee to be specified in Annex II to the framework contract will also be paid, for the duration of the meetings. Reimbursement shall occur provided that all expenses have been approved in advance by Cedefop and that relevant supporting documents have been provided. However, when travelling and attending meetings on behalf of Cedefop the medical officer will be solely responsible for his/her insurance coverage against accidents, damage, civil liability, etc.

Justification for the choice of accelerated procedure: The launch of an exceptional fast-track restricted procedure with publication of a contract notice is requested for the following reasons:

- the entry into force of the new contract as of 1.10.2012 is a prerequisite to minimise interruption of services. The completion of an open call for tenders by this date is not feasible,
- in accordance with the minimum time limits allowed for this type of procedure, it is foreseen to give to candidates 25 calendar days for submission of their applications and to the selected tenderers 19 days for submission of their tenders. Due to the fact that the documents to be submitted for the selection phase are

existing documents easy to compile, and that the award phase consists of a single interview together with a financial offer (a price per hour), the time limits foreseen to be applied are considered reasonable for the receipt of quality applications and tenders,

— since this procedure is addressed to the local market, a response from local doctors is therefore expected. This can ensure their availability to comply with the relatively tight timetable due to the objective Cedefop constraints.
