

Cyprus: cross-country cooperation for robotics curriculum development



Cyprus participated in the EU-funded RoboVET project, launched on 1 October 2018 and completed on 31 December 2020. A partnership of 10 partners from Portugal, Spain and Cyprus, the project targeted a wide range of groups: VET

learners and trainers, VET providers, public VET regulatory bodies, companies (especially SMEs). Read more **here**.

Czechia: new education strategy 2030+



In October 2020, the Government adopted the **Strategy for education 2030+.** It includes reflections on both emerging social and technological challenges, such as fourth industrial revolution, and unsatisfactory aspects of the Czech education system, such as: the long-term declining quality of initial

education, employers' dissatisfaction by school graduates' skills, an increasing share of early leavers from education, and the growing selectivity of the Czech education system. Read more **here**.

Greece: fostering apprenticeship through partnerships



Skills he Central Union of Chambers of Greece (KEEE) designed the project **Upgrade and expansion of apprenticeships – Apprenticeship partnerships**, contributing to the institutionalisation of apprenticeship in Greece as a key means of connecting VET with

the labour market and fighting youth unemployment. It aims to encourage companies to offer apprenticeship placements and support the implementation of the work-placed part of apprenticeship programmes. Read more **here.**

Estonia: five years of future jobs and skills forecasting with OSKA

Estonia has invested heavily in recent years in its skills governance, mainly through the jobs and skills forecasting system OSKA. Five years ago, the Estonian Qualifications Authority began conducting research that analyses the need for skills and labour over the next decade and compares this to VET, HE and continuing education provision. In October 2020, the training programme Youth + Digital (Jovem + Digital) was launched. This programme targets young unemployed people aged 18-35, who are upper-secondary or higher education graduates, aiming to improve their digital competences. It runs under the
