#### WHAT ARE THE ADULT EDUCATION CENTRES-CPIAs?

CPIAs are public schools established by the Ministry of Education to encourage the personal, cultural, social and economic growth of citizens

Which courses can they attend?

- language and social integration courses for foreigners (Italian L2)
- programs aimed at acquiring middle school and upper secondary diplomas

Who can enroll in the CPIA?

- All Italian and/or foreign citizens over 16 years of age
- Foreign citizens must be in possession of a valid residence permit.

Who are the teachers?

• Teachers appointed by the Ministry of Education with specific experience in adult education.

Supporting the process of credit recognition and the personalization of the individual training plan

#### In addition...

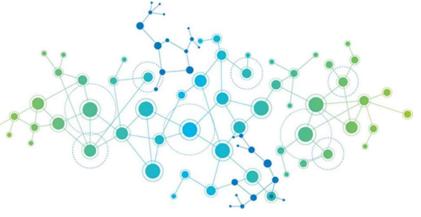
- ➤ Contribute to the future development of the tool in collaboration with OECD

### THE TESTING DESIGN

14 Adult Education Centresin14 Italian Regions

#### 316 students

- 60% are young people up to 34 years old
- 52% are men
- 81% are in possession of a Final diploma of the first cycle of education
- More than 60% re unemployed
- 47% are foreigners



34 teachers

 teachers took an actively part in the different phases of the project (design, training, management and results)

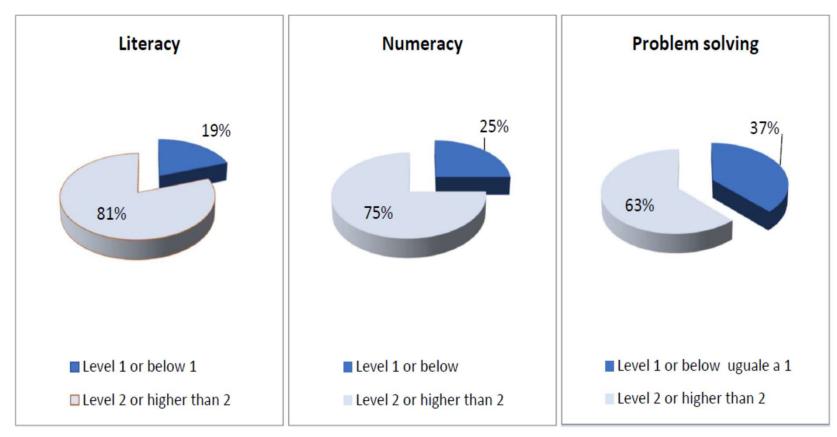

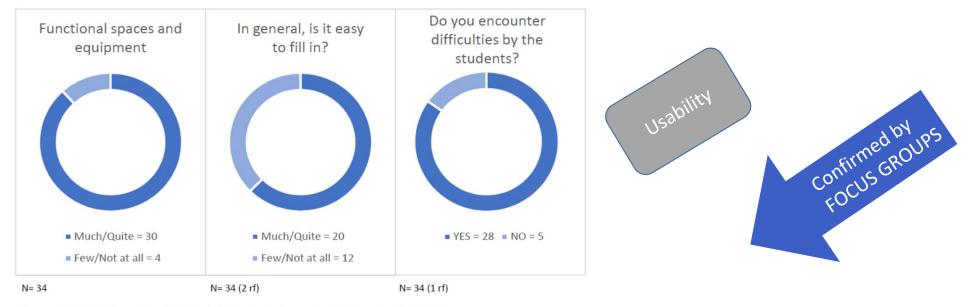
### **COGNITIVE SKILLS LEVELS**

8 out of 10 students are in an area of potential credit recognition

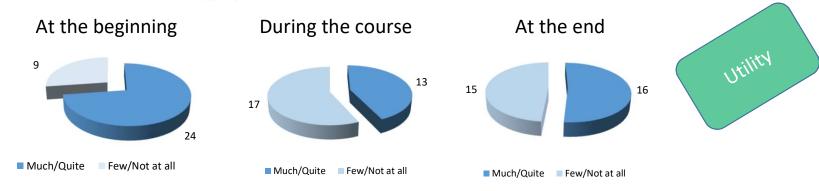

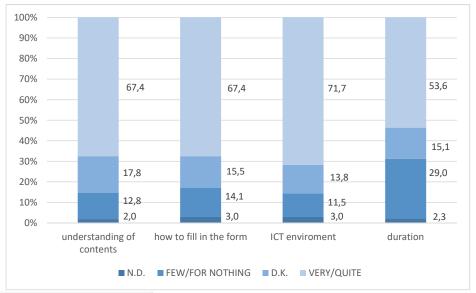

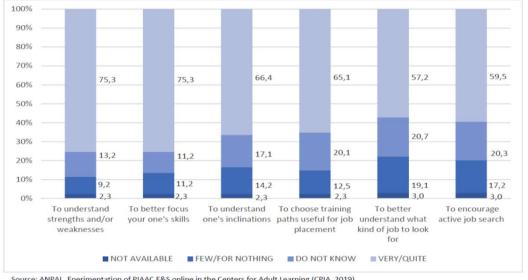

## **Lessons learned**

- √ 92% of students are able to face standardized tests on ICT platform
- ✓ The usability and usefulness of third party, authoritative, standardized tool, such as PIAAC online, to support of the different phases of VNFIL, the credits recognition and personalization of the pathway.
- ✓ An extensive use of this kind of tool can guarantee the quality assurance of the process by providing a common and homogeneous standard
- ✓ The importance of using this kind of tool in complementarity with other tools already used
- ✓ The advantage to have an internationally recognized and multilingual tool
- ✓ The necessity to have an offline version of the tool for no connection contexts.
- ✓ The necessity to integrate the tool with standardized tests for assessing other typologies of skills
- ✓ The necessity to reduce the duration of the test to avoid negative effects on the level of participation



## **Future plans**

- ☐ The progressive expansion of the NQF through the definition of national reference frameworks of key competences, in coherence with the European sectoral frameworks and the international standards and classifications as reference points for VNFIL
- ☐ Possible lines of integration between adult education and work services
- ☐ Large scale recurrent analysis in support of the Italian strategy for LLL and evidence based policies
- ☐ Providing feedback to the Implementation of a second release of the PIAAC on line tool taking in consideration the pilot testing projects realized in other countries involving different target groups
