Project concept & key innovations

- ,one-stop guidance' model connecting education, employment and lifelong learning sectors
- Inspired by the *Cités des Métiers* approach and a lifelong, inclusive guidance
- Shared physical guidance space enabling direct cooperation among practitioners
- Cross-sector referrals, peer learning, coordinated user support

Objectives

- Improve access to LLG for all age groups
- Strengthen cross-sector cooperation and referral pathways
- Support career management skills and transitions
- Increase visibility; outreach of guidance services

Participating networks

- Public Employment Service (PES)
- Adult education providers
- School counselling services
- Higher education career centres
- NGOs and local partners

Pilot implementation (Ljubljana, 2023)

- 10 days / 40 hours (afternoon delivery)
 - 30 counsellors from 6 networks
 - 94 services delivered (~85 users)
 - Users: pupils, students, adults
- 2024 – Community center Rog, Ljubljana, Adult learning Centre
2025 – Informativa, PES one day event (employers meet job seekers)



Sustainability, professionalisation & future development

Accessibility & inclusion (piloting, findings 2023)

- Free of charge, no referral required
- Centralised and low-threshold access
- Flexible opening hours
- Need for stronger outreach to adults

Evaluation & impact

- Systematic monitoring and evaluation
- High user and practitioner satisfaction
- Increased visibility of lifelong guidance
- Stronger professional networking

Practitioner training & cooperation

- Pre-event joint training
- 76% reported improved readiness
- Strong emphasis on peer learning
- Cross-sector competence development

Funding & sustainability challenges

- No additional dedicated budget
- In-kind institutional contributions: staff working hours; premises; materials and promotion
- Need for stable governance and sustainable funding
