Project description	 Cedefop has developed a web toolkit for tackling early leaving (VTL) aimed for policy makers and VET practitioners involved in the design, implementation and evaluation of VET policies and practices to tackle early leaving. The VTL toolkit is based on an extensive evidence of research published recently by Cedefop. It provides with practical guidance, tips, good practices and tools for policy makers and VET practitioners working to support learners at risk and early school leavers. A new similar toolkit on "Raising youth employment for people non in education, training and employment (NEETs)" will be published in 2021. These toolkits are supported by a virtual community coordinated by Cedefop, the network of ambassadors tackling early leaving from VET. Ambassadors are policy makers, learning providers, experts and other key stakeholders involved in tackling early leaving from VET at national, regional or local level in Europe. They help disseminate the toolkits and enrich their resources by sending good practices, news, publications and statistics. They are invited

They work in the context of innovation, globalisation, rapid technological and societal changes that set challenges to education and training systems across Europe and globally. They have a key role in implementing national and European reforms and to support all VET learners to qualify, including learners at risk of early leaving. The findings of this feasibility study will enrich the resources of the abovementioned toolkits and will support several other Cedefop projects, such as apprenticeships, guidance, etc.
Project outputs / outcomes	 New content developments and tools of the toolkit are appropriate, functional and user-friendly; Increased visibility of the VET toolkit for tackling early leaving and the new toolkit on Raising youth employment for NEETs to be launched in 2021; Preliminary findings of a feasibility study on a European survey for VET teachers and trainers feed into the above two toolkits and enrich their resources.

Contributing to the development and promotion of the VET toolkit for Tackling Early Leaving and the forthcoming one on Raising Youth Employment for NEETs: Undertake preliminary research on related themes, such as teachers and trainers, inclusive education and training Review the newly uploaded content and regularly test the appropriate functioning of the tools to ensure user-friendliness. Prepare brief messages and content for dissemination through Cedefop social media and other appropriate dissemination channels in collaboration with the project manager and the communication's department of Cedefop. Assist in preparation of visually attractive presentations and create graphic materials to be used in different presentations/events. Support the work of the content management editor (CMS) editor to update and regularly check content online.
