Crude facts

- 52% of people in general education were never informed about VET
- 25% were advised against taking VET



45% of low qualified had not heard of it or didn't know what it is

 PES, S. Security
- Guarantee entitlement to support
- Go to the streets, go to communities and contact





Give the right support



- Tailored assess, clarify, plan
- Holistic career, psychological, physical
- Inform and prepare choice, basic skills





Link to learning and validation



- Guidance takes into account flexible qualifying pathways
- Early assessments already support upskilling
- Objectives and portfolios link to validation

- Exchange of personal information
- Entitlement to welfare support
- Holistic, tailored support
- Portfolio based, aiming at upskilling
